



Definition:

Modalverben drücken die Handlungsabsicht einer Person aus (Fähigkeit, Wunsch, Erlaubnis).

Man unterscheidet: können, sollen, dürfen, müssen.

Da im Englischen mit Modalverben nicht alle Zeiten gebildet werden können, verwendet man Ersatzformen.

Modalverb "können"

Modalverb: können Englisch: can Ersatzform: to be able to

Beispiel: I can work./Present Simple

1. P.EZ. I am able to work.

1. P.MZ. We are able to work.

2. P.EZ. You are able to work. 2. P.MZ. You are able to work.

3. P.EZ. He/she/it is able to work. 3. P.MZ. They are able to work.

Modalverb "müssen"

Modalverb: müssen Englisch: must Ersatzform: to have to

Beispiel: I must work/Present Simple:

1. P.EZ. I have to work.

1. P.MZ. We have to work.

2. P.EZ. You have to work. 2. P.MZ. You have to work.

3. P.EZ. He/she/it has to work. 3. P.MZ. They have to work.

Modalverb "dürfen"

Modalverb: dürfen Englisch: may Ersatzform: to be allowed to

Beispiel: I may work./Present Simple

1. P.EZ. I am allowed to work.

1. P.MZ. We are allowed to work.

2. P.EZ. You are allowed work.
2. P.MZ. You are allowed to work.

3. P.EZ. He/she/it is allowed to work.

3. P.MZ. They are allowed to work.

Modalverb "sollen"

Modalverb: sollen Englisch: shall Ersatzform: to be supposed to

Beispiel: I shall work./Present Simple

1. P.EZ. I am supposed to work.

1. P.MZ. We are supposed to work.

2. P.EZ. You are supposed to work.

2. P.MZ. You are supposed to work.

3. P.EZ. He/she/it is supposed to work.

3. P.MZ. They are supposed to work.

Modalverb "nicht müssen"

Modalverb: nicht müssen Englisch: need not Ersatzform: not to have to

Beispiel: I need not work./Present Simple

1. P.EZ. I don't have to work.

1. P.MZ. We don't have to work.

2. P.EZ. You don't have to work. 2. P.MZ. You don't have to work.

3. P.EZ. He/she/it doesn't have to work.

3. P.MZ. They don't have to work.

Modalverb "nicht dürfen"

Modalverb: nicht dürfen Englisch: must not Ersatzform: not to be allowed to

Beispiel: I must not work./Present Simple

1. P.EZ. I am not allowed to work. 1. P.MZ. We aren't allowed to work.

2. P.EZ. You are not allowed work. 2. P.MZ. You aren't allowed to work.

3. P.EZ. He/she/it isn't allowed to work. 3. P.MZ. They aren't allowed to work.

Modalverb "brauchen"

Modalverb: brauchen Englisch: need Ersatzform: to have to

Beispiel: I need to work/Present Simple:

1. P.EZ. I have to work. 1. P.MZ. We have to work.

2. P.EZ. You have to work. 2. P.MZ. You have to work.

3. P.EZ. He/she/it has to work. 3. P.MZ. They have to work.
